Play Therapy with Teens & Tweens:

Individual & Family Interventions

Be prepared for fun while learning play therapy, adventure therapy, and expressive art techniques; directive sand tray activities; Adlerian concepts and strategies; and life coaching interventions to help preteens and teens gain a sense of belonging and positive identity, increase self-esteem, build relationships, and learn to share power. You will also learn strategies for helping families of tweens and teens improve communication and interactional patterns.

Learning Objectives

- Identify primary issues and challenges of working with latency and adolescent age clients in play therapy.
- Use selected play therapy techniques with pre-adolescent and adolescent clients.
- Use selected art and expressive arts techniques with pre-adolescent and adolescent clients (and/or their families).
- Use selected adventure/experiential therapy techniques with pre-adolescent and adolescent clients (and/or their families).

Friday, September 14

Play Therapy with Angry & Aggressive Clients

This workshop is designed to help play therapists understand the internal dynamics of the angry child. Using an Adlerian approach, participants will learn how to conceptualize the child's lifestyle and resulting behavior. Workshop participants will also have the opportunity to learn and practice a variety of techniques to help clients gain insight about their lifestyles and resolve underlying issues that result in angry and defiant behavior. In addition, participants will have the opportunity learn and practice a variety of art, expressive, experiential, and play techniques to appropriately express and manage their anger.

Learning Objectives:

After the session, participants will be able to:

- Identify the underlying dynamics of children who present with angry, defiant, and aggressive behavior.
- Increase a child client's coping strategies to assist clients in managing hyperarousal and develop emotional regulation.
- Identify techniques to help a child client explore and express thoughts and feelings associated with trauma.
- Practice selected art and expressive arts techniques to use with angry and defiant play therapy clients.
- Practice selected experiential play therapy techniques to use with angry and defiant play therapy clients.

Dr. Jeff Ashby is a Professor in the Department of Counseling and Psychological Services at Georgia State University. He is the former Director of the Georgia State Play Therapy Training Institute, a Licensed Psychologist, and a Registered Play Therapist Supervisor. In addition, he is the Co-Director of Georgia State's Center for the Study of Stress, Trauma, and Resilience, and a Diplomate of the American Board of Professional Psychology. Jeff has authored over 100 professional journal articles and book chapters and regularly presents at professional conferences.
